## Implementation Solutions Using Reports (Teachers)

If you want to....	Try this!	Why?
Find out the strengths /weaknesses of the class	Select <a href="#">Class Summary Report</a> * Select by subject Click Suggested Topics or Performance Level Breakdown	This can help teachers know what topics to re-teach or focus more class time on!
Look at individual statistics for a student's progress	Select <a href="#">Individual Student Report</a> Choose the student you'd like to view.	Find out what needs a student has for help in tutoring, guided practice and mini-lessons!
How much of the program has been passed with a blue ribbon by students	Select <a href="#">Blue Ribbon Report</a> Select the class and program you wish to view. Once run, click on a student's percentage under a subject to view that student's statistics.	This is a quick way to see the percentage of blue ribbons (mastery) your students have.
View a breakdown of all students and progress within all subjects, topics and standards	Select <a href="#">Class Gradebook Report</a> * Choose how you'd like to view class statistics: by subject, program, topic, etc.  When running this report, you also have access to individual student reports.	You can view your class statistics in several different ways. You can even filter by dates and times if you want to see a specific amount of data!
View missed content within a session for individual students	Select <a href="#">Individual Student Report</a> Select the student, program and subject you'd like to view. Once the report has loaded, click on the session number for the topic you'd like to view. Once that screen loads, click on view missed to see exactly what problems your student missed. (You can view sessions from your <a href="#">Class Gradebook Report</a> also)	Use the data for help pinpointing specific needs within an objective. Gear your teaching to hit exactly the kinds of questions your students need.

\* Teachers will want students organized into classes by using [Class Manager](#) in order to make viewing data easier.
